SERVICE AND FIRE PREVENTION

The Memphremagog East Intermunicipal Fire Prevention and Protection Board has been in operation since January 2018.

It currently serves 10 municipalities on the territory of the MRC de Magog and Coaticook: Hatley, Hatley Township, North Hatley, St.-Catherine of Hatley, Ayer's Cliff, Stanstead, Stanstead Township, Stanstead-East, Ogden, Barnston West.

The Board includes:

- 4 Fire Halls (North Hatley, Stanstead Township, Ayer's Cliff and Stanstead)
- 1 full time director
- 4 leaders in part-time operations
- 100 firefighters and officers on call


STRATEGIC PLAN

Fire Hall and Town Hall – architectural perspective

Question Period: Summary of issues raised at the presentation

Social: <u>24 questions and comments regarding</u>: the infrastructure of gravel roads, road safety, noise on the roads, the feeling of belonging, attraction of new families, redesign of zoning (mini homes, center for the elderly, businesses), beautification of the village of Fitch Bay. Questions about the new fire hall/town hall: costs, design, location.

Environment: <u>14 questions and comments regarding</u>: Fitch Bay (noise, waves, water quality), glass recycling, cleanliness, composting toilets.

Economic: <u>4 questions and comments regarding</u>: Explain what is agrotourism, more details around the municipal support, the tourist committee.

WINTER IS COMING AND HERE ARE SOME RULES TO FOLLOW:

Do not put snow in the ditches, on the shoulders of roads and on the opposite side of your main entrance. It is prohibited to park or immobilize a road vehicle on a municipal street between 11 pm and 8 am from November 1st to April 1st inclusively, as indicated by signs. It is also prohibited to park on the side of the road where the speed limit is 70 km or more.

Tempo Shelter Permitted: Between November 1st and April 15th of the following year.

FITCH BAY PROJECT

Phragmite control activities

Eradicate an invasive perennial plant Conservation inc. called Phragmite. Invasive alien plants are plants that are introduced intentionally or accidentally into an ecosystem and grow at the detriment of native species. Their proliferation is considered one of the main causes of the loss of biodiversity in the world and can have serious ecological, economic and health consequences. Preventing the introduction and spread of invasive alien plants is the best way to avoid or reduce their negative impacts. (Taken from Memphremagog Conservation Inc.)

The organization and about fifteen collaborators removed Phragmites from Fitch Bay on Lake Memphremagog. This task was done over two days. The goal eliminating the phragmite is to give several biodiversities way to includina spawning arounds. According to a study, the Phragmite harvested last year has not grown

back this year.

THE NUMBER OF GARBAGE COLLECTION



This year the Council has reduced the number of garbage collections to encourage people to better sort their residual materials. By 2020, putrescible

organic materials will not be accepted at the dump. Citizens are invited to recycle and compost, moreover the number of compost collections has been increased. If you do everything correctly, nothing should attract unwanted animals to your garbage cans.

As of January 2019, the garbage collection will be done over 2 days with two different sectors, which will be identified in the new calendar 2019. Let's try together to protect the Earth and make everyone win, including generations. The gestures are easy: instead of putting everything in your trash, direct your food waste in your brown bin. All your cartons, boxes, cardboard packs, canned goods and your Publisac into your blue bin. Let's put the odds on our side to improve the quality of life for all. These small gestures can make a big difference. Thank you for your collaboration.



WASTE IN THE LAKE

Project Aware was held in association with Memphremagog Conservation Inc., Aqua Mondo as well as several volunteers and divers who have surveyed the bottom of Lake Memphremagog at Georgeville. This organization is everywhere in the world to clean waterways. Tires, bottles, building materials and other debris were brought to the surface by the divers. 500 kilos of rubbish were recovered from




the bottom of the lake. Did you know that nearly 70% of marine debris sinks into the waterbed where it can persist for decades - damaging their habitat and injuring marine life.

WHAT CAN WE DO? It is certain that we must at all costs avoid throwing anything in the waterways, but it is enough to modify certain habits and to apply some basic rules to avoid contributing to the degradation of waterways. Here are some examples: • Along the water's edge, modify ornamental, choose native species that require less water, fertilizer and pesticides. • Reduce the use of lawn products. • Avoid throwing garbage, animal droppings, leaves and debris into ditches and manholes. • Properly dispose of used oils, antifreezes, paints and other chemicals. The majority of liquid residuals can be brought into the ecocentres. • Clean the yard entrance with a broom rather than with the garden hose for asphalted driveways. • Prevent and control erosion on your land, especially if it is riparian zone, by planting native vegetation. Protect our lakes and rivers, one of our important natural resources. (Source: The APPEL Newsletter, Fall 2011).

NEW BELVEDERE TO COME

We are awaiting authorization from the CPTAQ to erect a two-storey belvedere located on Sheldon Road. The owners of the land have already given us their consent.
